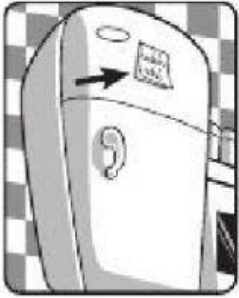

She likes reading about inventions that we use every day. She talked about

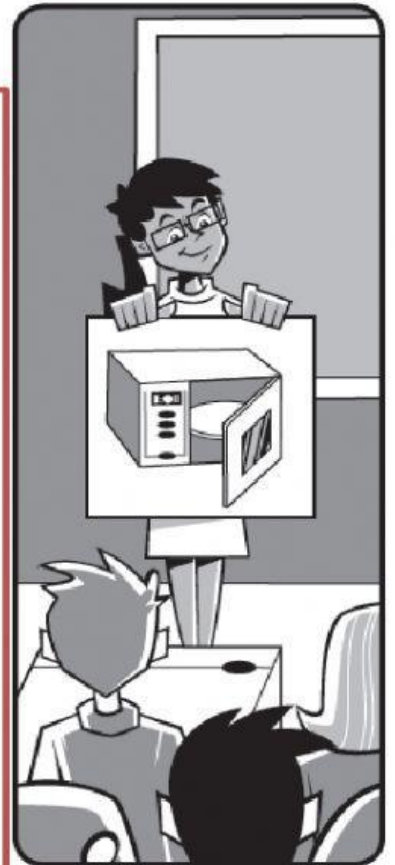
two inventors from the USA: Josephine Cochrane and Percy Spencer.

Josephine Cochrane was born in 1839. She was a very rich woman who liked having parties, but didn't like washing the dishes. Her servants did this for her, but she wasn't very happy because sometimes they broke the plates.

She wanted a machine to wash her plates quickly and without breaking them. She invented the first dishwasher in 1886. In the beginning, it was used in hotels and restaurants, then in people's houses.

Percy Spencer was a scientist who worked with radars in the 1940s. One day he walked past a radar machine and a chocolate bar in his pocket melted.

Percy noticed this and went to get some popcorn seeds. He put the seeds in front of the machine and they started popping! That's how he invented the microwave. Percy didn't finish school, but he learned chemistry, physics and maths by himself. Isn't he amazing?
