perfect example of something

words spoken, or sounds made, in a short, sharp way

to successfully deal with a problem

A feeling of stress, worry, unease or excitement created by two opposing forces, ideas or personalities

The main character in a story

The character or thing that causes problems for the protagonist

having human characteristics

someone who seems intelligent but is not

features or quality of a person, place or thing

	A performance made without a script or much preparation
	When people come together to work on a creative project that isn't yet finished
	not planned or thought about; natural and sudden
	Someone who is given lots of nice things and then expects to get their own way
	Communication done without words, only movement and gesture
	A person who guides actors by giving them ideas and suggestions
	the way someone acts or feels in response to something
	to think quickly
	to make something bigger, better or more complex
	different or opposite and likely to cause disagreement or a fight
