## Grade 6 Grammar Principle Parts of Regular Verbs



A verb has four principal parts: the present, the present participle, the past, and the past participle.

Present	Present Participle	Past	Past Participle
watch	(am, is, are) watching	watched	(has, have, had) watched
study	(am, is, are) studying	studied	(has, have, had) studied

A regular verb forms its past and past participle by adding -ed or -d to the present form.

- The present and the past forms can be used by themselves as verbs.
- The present participle and the past participle are always used with a helping verb.

## **EXAMPLES**:

He <u>walks</u> toward us in a hurry. (present)
June is walking to the park. (present participle)
They <u>walked</u> to the park. (past)
We <u>have walked</u> three miles in the last hour. (past participle)
