


INTONATION PATTERNS



Intonation and stress are closely linked. In fact, it's impossible to dissociate them. Intonation is about how we say things, rather than what we say, the way the voice rises and falls when speaking, in other words the music of the language. There are two basic patterns of intonation in English: falling intonation and rising intonation.
