Today, we have two more kinds of nouns to explore.

A noun which gives the name to some state, quality, feeling or idea that we can only think of or feel but cannot touch or see is called **abstract noun**.

The words heat, beauty, love, sympathy, anger, truth, jealousy, pride are all **abstract nouns**.

A noun which gives the name of a collection of common nouns (person, place or thing) taken together and spoken of as one whole is called **collective noun**.

The words like army, pack, group, fleet, bunch, class, team, crowd, pride, herd, swarm, flock are all **collective nouns**.
