In the past, people used sponges every day. Egyptians collected them for bathing and cleaning. Greeks painted with them and Roman soldiers used them as toilet paper!

Natural sponges are different from the colorful synthetic ones at the supermarket. Real sponges are animals. They live in the sea. They don't have muscles, nerves, or internal organs.

There are 5,000 different types of natural sponges. Their Latin name is *porifera*. It means "to have holes."

Sponges may be simple, but they are very interesting. They filter seawater and they build coral reefs. They also produce chemicals that help cure cancer. You can find 16,000 animals living on one sponge!

Sponges are amazing, but there's a problem with natural sponges. Many people use them for bathing. But when people take sponges out of the sea, it damages the environment. Can you think of any solutions?
