



Simple and Compound Sentences

A simple sentence has only one verb.

Example: *The dragon lives in the water.*

Simple sentence can be joined together using joining words to make a compound sentence.

Compound sentence is made up of two simple sentences

Joined with *and, but, so, or or*.

Example: *The dragon lives in the water and flies in the air.*

Identify the sentences as a simple or compound sentence. Write (S) for a simple sentence and (C) for a compound sentence in the box provided.

2. The dragon can swim in the water or it can fly in the air.
