



We use COULD when we speak about our abilities in the past. For example:

I COULD eat a lot of sweets when I was 10 years old.

I COULD swim in the sea when I was 9 years old.

I COULD travel on a plane when my dad worked in Madrid.

We use the negative form of could, COULDN'T (COULD+NOT) to speak about things we CAN DO now but in the past we COULDN'T. For example:

I COULDN'T drive a car when I was sixteen.

I COULDN'T go out with my friends when I was eight.

I COULDN'T live away when I was younger.

To form COULD/COULDN'T we write: COULD + verb without to.

COULD FLY instead of ~~COULD TO FLY~~

COULD EAT instead of ~~COULD TO EAT~~

COULDN'T DO instead of ~~COULDN'T TO DO~~

COULDN'T DRAW instead of ~~COULDN'T TO DRAW~~

To Form questions we change the order of could and the person (subject).

COULD YOU PLAY CHESS LAST YEAR? No, I couldn't

COULD YOUR DAD DRIVE A CAR WHEN HE WAS YOUNG? Yes, he could.

If the answer is affirmative we write: YES, (the person) COULD

If the answer is negative we write: NO, (the person) COULDN'T

To form questions with WH- (When, what, who, where, why) we write WH-word following by COULD + the person + the verb (without to) + the question....?

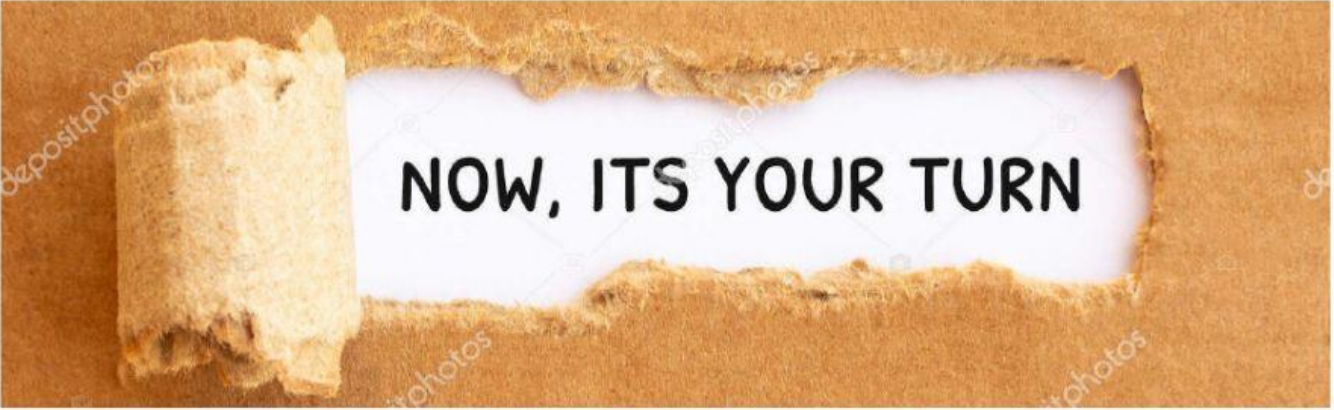
