

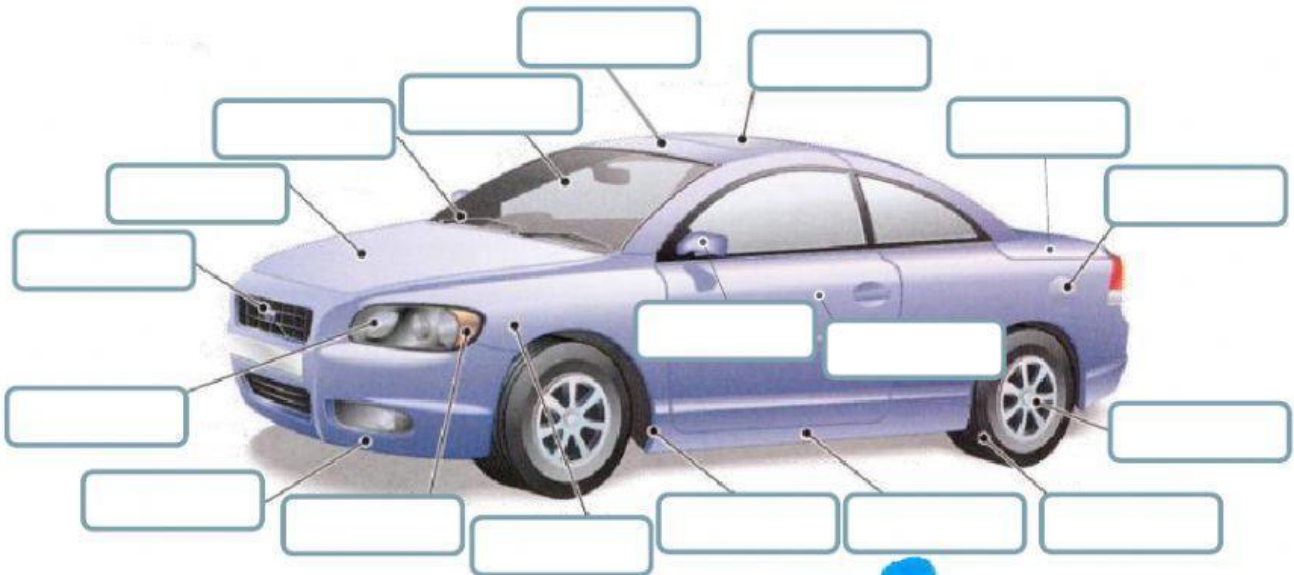
PARTS OF A CAR. THE EXTERIOR

EXERCISE 3

Put these steps for changing a flat tyre in the right order.

Start like this...

Put a vehicle into gear or park	
	Remove the flat tyre from under the vehicle
	Take the spare tyre out of the boot
	Use a jack to raise the vehicle
	Fit the spare tyre and tighten the wheel nuts
	Check again to make sure the wheel nuts are tight
	Loosen the wheel nuts slightly
	Loosen the wheel nuts more and remove them
	Lower the car back down to the ground
