Tyrannosaurus was a large reptile that lived many years ago. Scientists believe that many tyrannosaurus lived in the northern part of American continent. Tyrannosaurus Rex is believed to have lived in forests, near rivers, and in areas that were open and full of prey (animal that is hunted and killed by another for food). They were carnivorous, meaning they ate mostly meat. Now, they are no longer living on earth because they are extinct.

High in dense bamboo forests in the misty, rainy mountains of southwestern China lives one of the world's rarest mammals: the giant panda, also called the panda. Only about 1,500 of these black-and-white relatives of bears survive in the wild. However, the population has started to increase slightly, thanks to breeding programs in China. Pandas eat almost nothing but bamboo shoots and leaves.

Living in the grasslands and open woodlands of sub-Saharan Africa, the lion is the second largest cat in the world. They belong to the mammals animal group. Lions usually hunt for meat at night. Their prey includes antelopes, buffaloes, zebras, young elephants, rhinos, hippos, wild hogs, crocodiles and giraffes. African lions are considered vulnerable of extinction with only around 20,000 in the wild.
