

### The Birth of Superman

Early in 1933, while he was a high school student, Jerry Siegel wrote a short comic story called "The Reign of the Superman". Joe Shuster, his classmate and best friend, drew all the pictures for Siegel's story. The main character of the short story was Superman, a bad man who wanted to control the whole world. In June 1933, Siegel wrote another story whose main character was also called Superman. The character of Superman in Siegel's second story was a strong man who didn't have any superpowers and who didn't wear any special costume.

Siegel sent his second comic story to a lot of publishers, but nobody wanted to publish it. Siegel thought that publishers turned his story down because Shuster and he were very young. So he decided to look for an older, famous artist to draw the pictures for his comic story. However, when he told Shuster what he was planning to do, Shuster got very angry and burnt the story. In 1934, Siegel asked artist Russell Keaton to draw the pictures for his comic story. However, for a second time, nobody wanted to publish it. Then, Siegel and Shuster became friends again. They worked together and developed a new Superman character.

The new Superman in the third comic story had a very characteristic appearance. He wore a blue costume with a red and yellow 'S' on it and a red cape. This Superman was born on the planet Krypton. When he was a baby, his father, who was a scientist, sent him to Earth because the planet Krypton was going to be destroyed. When Superman came to the Earth, a farmer and his wife found him and took him to their home. They gave him the name Clark Kent and raised him as if he had been their own child. When he grew up, Clark worked as a journalist for a newspaper. Nobody at the newspaper knew about his superhuman abilities. However, every time somebody was in danger, Clark wore his Superman costume and flew to save people's lives.

In 1938, Siegel and Shuster's comic story with the superhero Superman was finally published. It was an immediate success and led to the creation of other superheroes such as Batman and Wonder Woman.

### The Blue Whale

Blue Whales are the largest living animals that have ever lived on the planet Earth. They are even larger than the largest dinosaurs that ever lived. They are about 30 metres long and weigh about 200 tons. When they are born, their weight reaches 6,000 pounds. Although Blue Whales are huge, they mainly eat tiny sea animals known as krill. They may eat more than 8,000 pounds of krill in a single day.

Blue Whales live in all the world's oceans. They usually like swimming alone or in pairs, but sometimes they swim in groups. In the summer, they live in very cold waters, but in winter time, they move to warmer waters. They are fast swimmers. They usually swim at about eight kilometres an hour, but when they are scared, they can travel at more than 32 kilometres an hour. They make very loud noises to communicate with each other. They have excellent hearing and can hear sounds which are 1,500 kilometres away.

Blue Whales can live very long, about 80 to 90 years. However, there are not many left in the world's oceans today because people used to hunt them. People used their oil to make soap and cooking oil. They also used their meat for food and their skin to make umbrellas. Between 1900 and 1960, 360,000 were killed. In 1966, Blue Whales became an endangered species and came under protection of the law. So fewer people hunted them. In 1986, there was another law that did not allow anyone to hunt whales. However, there are still some people who hunt Blue Whales for food.






