Review of past simple and past continuous

Yesterday
Last x
Ago In

Past Simple (Regular/Irregular)

We use Past Simple to express:

- An action that happened at a define time in the past.
- Actions that happened immediately one after the other in the past.



Examples:

- I didn't go to the cinema yesterday (negative).
- I always visited my Friends in my summer holidays (affirmative).
- Did she talk wirh you on the last day of school? (interrogative)-

At the
same time
While

Past continuous (Was/were (not) + verb+ing)

We use Past Continuous to express:

- An action that was in progress at a stated time in the past
 - Two actions that were happening at the same time
- An action thar was in progress (longer action) when another action interrupted it.



Examples:

- Last night, at 7 pm, I was having dinner (affirmative).
- While she was doing her homework, her brother wasn't playing football (negative).
- Was she cooking when I phone her? (interrogative).
