

1. Choose the correct wh-word →	→ What? <u>An orange.</u>
2. Transform the affirmative structure into an interrogative structure →	Affirmative: I am eating ↓ ↓ → Interrog.: Are you eating... ?
3. Use this word order: wh-word + Aux + S	What are you eating?
Exception: <u>wh-word</u> + (Aux) + V S	John is eating an apple. ↓ ↓ Who is eating an apple?
