




# Wh-words 4


a) Write the wh-word that each picture represents:

b) Remember how we ask a wh-question **when there is no auxiliary in the affirmative sentence:** ?

In the present <b>simple</b> and the past <b>simple</b> there are no auxiliaries:	I have breakfast <b><u>in the kitchen.</u></b> He gets up <b><u>at seven.</u></b> She travelled <b><u>by bus.</u></b>
1. Choose the correct wh-word →	→ <b>Where?</b> <u>In the kitchen.</u> → <b>What time?</b> <u>At seven.</u> → <b>How?</b> <u>By bus.</u>
2. Use <b>DO</b> / <b>DOES</b> for the present simple, or <b>DID</b> for the past. (Click on the auxiliaries to watch some videotutorials in Spanish.)	... <b>do</b> you <b>have</b> ...? ... <b>does</b> he <b>get up</b> ...? ... <b>did</b> she <b>travel</b> ...? <b>IMPORTANT:</b> write the main verb in the <b>infinitive: no -s, no -ed.</b>
3. Use this word order: wh-word + Aux + S	<b>Where do you</b> have breakfast? <b>What time does he</b> get up? <b>How did she</b> travel?
<b>Exception:</b> <u>wh-word</u> + ( <b>Aux</b> ) + V S	<b>John</b> cooked dinner today. ↓ ↓ <b>Who</b> cooked dinner today?
