A. GRAMMAR: COMPARATIVE AND SUPERLATIVE ADVERB (Trạng từ so sánh hơn và so sánh nhất)

1. Comparative adverb:

- Short adverbs (trạng từ ngắn):

S + be + **short adv** + **-er** + than + S/ N/ Pronoun

Ex: Can you come **earlier** tomorrow?

- Long adverbs (trạng từ dài):

S + be + **more** + **long adv** + than + S/ N/ Pronoun

Ex: Could you walk **more slowly**, please?

2. Superlative adverb:

- Short adverbs (trạng từ ngắn):

S + be + **the** + **short adv** + **-est** + than + S/ N/ Pronoun

Ex: Who worked **the hardest**?

- Long adverbs (trạng từ dài):

S + be + **the most** + **long adv** + than + S/ N/ Pronoun

Ex: Of all the students in the class, Martin speaks German **the most fluently**.

3. (NOT) AS ... + ADVERB + AS

Ex: I **can't** play the piano **as well as** Ernie.

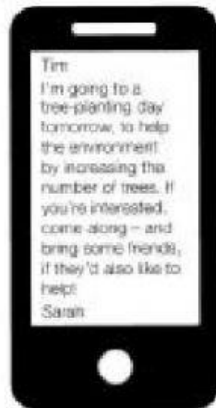

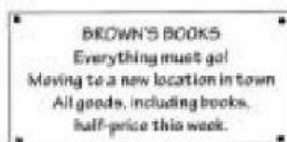

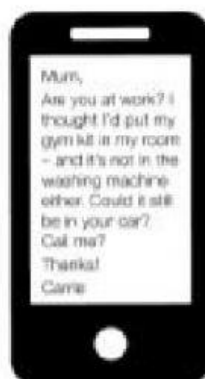
