	he	didn't have	homework,	he	'd play	video games.	

Real situation: I don't live near the beach, so I can't go swimming every day.

Imagined situation: If I lived near a beach, I would go swimming every day.

With **were**: If I/you/he/she/we/they **were** rich ...
