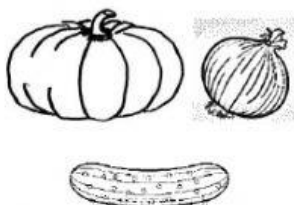

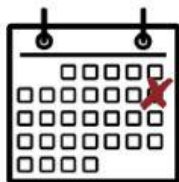

Instead, they go out for the first time and learn to hunt. When they are four months old, they can already find their own food! Bye-bye, mom and dad!
