Women and the First World War

After the outbreak of war in August 1914, as more and more men became _____ in the war effort, many women replaced them at work. There were other reasons why they did not _____ of women working in heavy industry. They felt that women would not be able to

By 1916 the war effort had _____ in a severe labour shortage, and the employment of women was to some extent _____ on an unwilling nation by circumstances.
