

Countable (=dénombrables) and uncountable (=indénombrables) nouns

1. Certains noms sont Ils ont donc une forme au singulier et une autre au pluriel.
ex: I've got *a sandwich* for you. →
Here are *two sandwiches* for you. →
2. Certains noms sont Ils ne peuvent être précédés d'un article indéfini et n'ont pas de forme au pluriel. Ils sont utilisés avec **some** et **any**.

SOME

On l'utilise avec des **phrases affirmatives**.

ex: We've got **some** ham.

ANY

On l'utilise avec :

- **des phrases négatives**.

ex: We haven't got **any** cheese.

- **des questions**.

ex: Have you got **any** cheese?

Do you want **any** juice?

Remarque:

Il est possible de rendre un nom **indénombrable** en un nom **dénombrable** en utilisant :

- *a cup of coffee*
- *a glass of water*
- *a bottle of wine*
- *a bowl of rice*
- *a piece of cake*
