

Adverb

1. Adverb is a word or phrase that modifies or qualifies an adjective, verb, or other adverb or a word group, expressing a relation of place, time, circumstance, manner, cause, degree, etc. (e.g., gently, quite, then, there).
2. An adverb is a word used to tell more about a verb, and it almost always answers the questions how? when? where? how often? and in what way? Words like **slowly, loudly, carefully, quickly, quietly or sadly** are all adverbs. Adverbs usually, but not always, end in -ly.

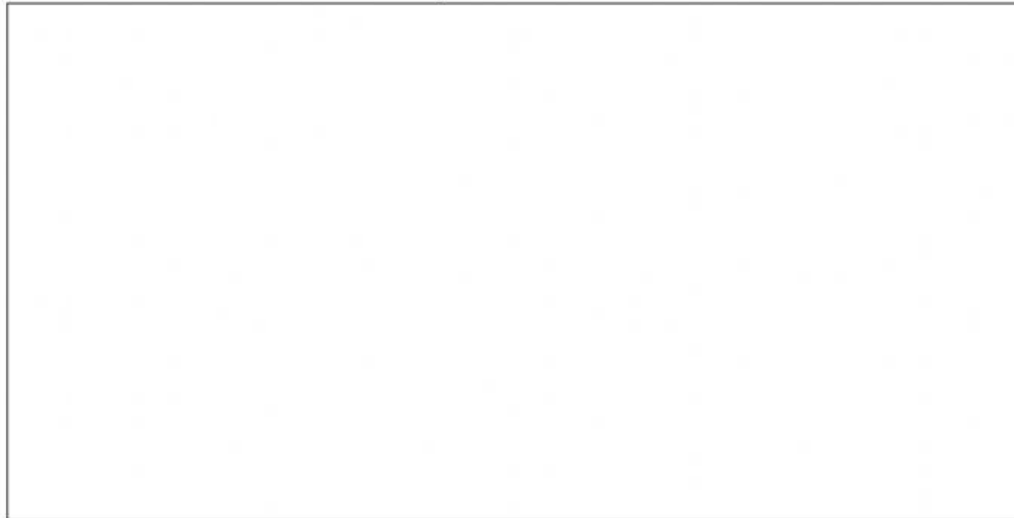
