

## Tell and Say

<b>tell + somebody (+something)</b>	<b>say + something (+to somebody)</b>
Ex: I told you it was time to go. Did you tell him? She told me that the meeting was canceled.	Ex: I said it was time to go. What did you say? She said that the meeting was canceled.
<b>tell + pronoun + clause</b>	<b>say + clause</b>
Ex: She told me (that) she would be late. They told us about the new movie.	Ex: She said she would be late. They said the new movie was great!
<b>tell the truth</b>	

## Speak and Talk

Speak and talk have similar meanings. They suggest that a person is using his or her voice, or that two or more people are having a discussion. Speak is slightly more formal.

<b>speak to somebody (about something)</b>	<b>talk to somebody (about something)</b>
Ex: I spoke to my boss yesterday.	Ex: I talked to my mom yesterday.
<b>speak a language</b>	<b>talk nonsense</b>
Ex: How many languages do you speak?	Ex: Ignore him. He's talking nonsense.
