

Tell and Say	
tell + somebody (+something)	say + something (+to somebody)
Ex: I told you it was time to go. Did you tell him? She told me that the meeting was canceled.	Ex: I said it was time to go. What did you say? She said that the meeting was canceled.
tell + pronoun + clause	say + clause
Ex: She told me (that) she would be late. They told us about the new movie.	Ex: She said she would be late. They said the new movie was great!
tell the truth	

Speak and Talk	
Speak and talk have similar meanings. They suggest that a person is using his or her voice, or that two or more people are having a discussion. Speak is slightly more formal.	
speak to somebody (about something)	talk to somebody (about something)
Ex: I spoke to my boss yesterday.	Ex: I talked to my mom yesterday.
speak a language	talk nonsense
Ex: How many languages do you speak?	Ex: Ignore him. He's talking nonsense.
