USE BATIK TO COLOR YOUR CLOTH

Batik today is found not only in the form of paintings, but the patterns are also used on garments as well. From the wall of the living room, traditional *Batik* has reach the urban markets, as supermodels all around the world parade, sashay in sarongs or caftans made using from the unique Indonesian *Batik* technique. *Batik* and *Tie and Die* can also go hand in hand to create beautiful works of art.

The materials you will need:

- Newspapers or cardboard
- 2 one-liter glass containers
- Red and yellow food coloring
- Hot water
- White cotton cloth (your batik)
- Tape
- A white crayon.



FIRST, cover your work area with newspaper or cardboard.

Mix a table spoon of yellow food coloring and $\frac{1}{2}$ cup of hot water in one of the glass containers.

Soak the cloth in the yellow coloring

Remove the cloth and let dry.

NEXT: tape the dry cloth on the cardboard or newspaper.

Draw a design on the cloth with the white crayon.

In the other glass container, mix a tablespoon of red coloring with $\frac{1}{2}$ cup of hot water. Soak the cloth in the red coloring. Remove the cloth and let dry. You now have a *Batik* design in yellow and orange. The wax of the crayon kept the red dye off the areas you drew on, so they stay yellow. The red and yellow dye made orange on the other areas


