

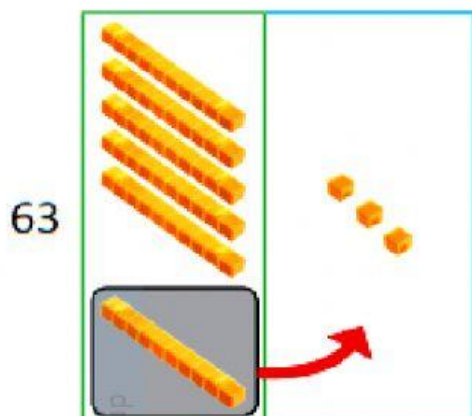


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Subtraction with Regrouping in Tens and Ones

1 a $63 - 27 = ?$



First, subtract the ones.
We cannot take away
7 ones from 3 ones.
So, we regroup the
tens and ones in 63.

Regroup the tens and
ones in 63.

6 tens 3 ones
= 5 tens 13 ones

Subtract the ones.

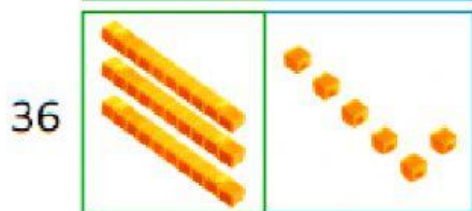
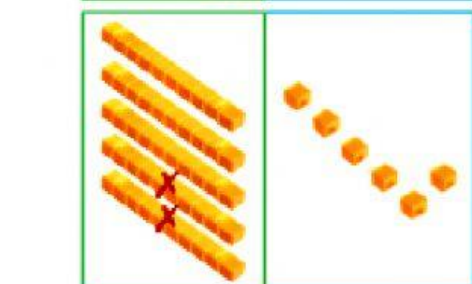
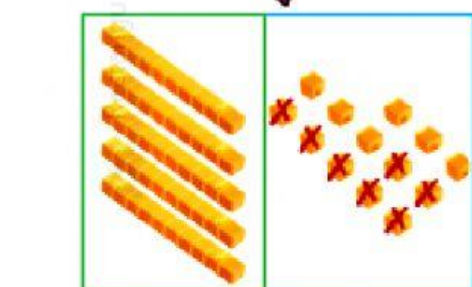
$$\begin{array}{r} 5 \text{ } 13 \\ \cancel{6} \cancel{3} \\ - 27 \\ \hline 6 \end{array}$$

13 ones – 7 ones = 6 ones

Then, subtract the tens.

$$\begin{array}{r} 5 \text{ } 13 \\ \cancel{6} \cancel{3} \\ - 27 \\ \hline 36 \end{array}$$

5 tens – 2 tens = 3 tens

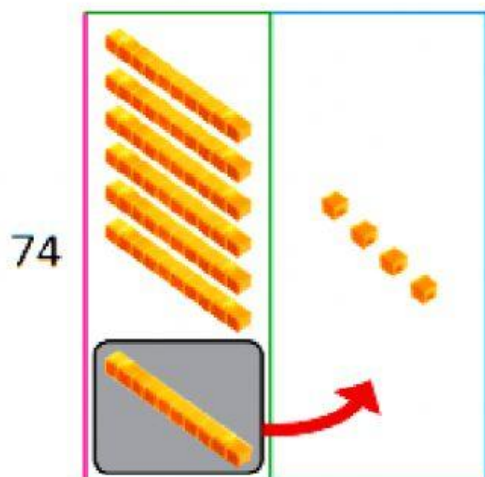


So, $63 - 27 = 36$.



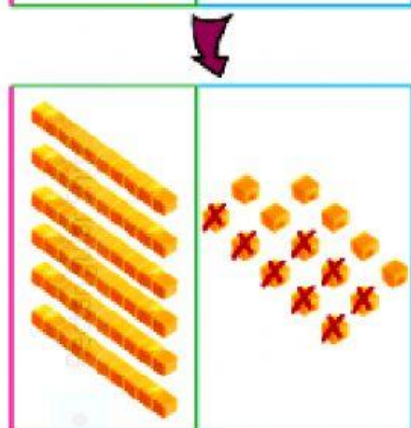
b $74 - 48 = ?$

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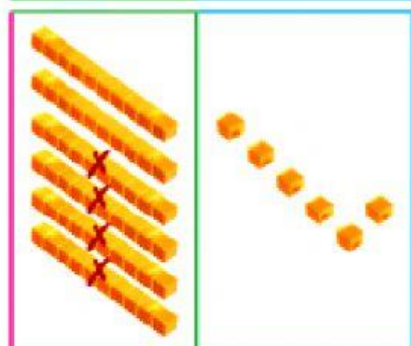
Regroup the tens and ones in 74.

tens ones
= tens ones



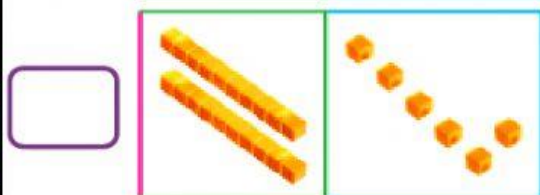
Subtract the ones.

ones - ones
= ones



Then, subtract the tens.

tens - tens
= tens



So, $74 - 48 =$.
