### The Red Dragon

The national flag of Wales is the Red Dragon. It depicts a red dragon on a green and white background.

The flag <sup>1</sup> ..... official status in 1959, but the red dragon itself has been a symbol of Wales <sup>2</sup> .....; indeed, the flag is sometimes claimed to be the oldest national flag <sup>3</sup> ..... There is a theory that the Romans brought the emblem to what is now Wales <sup>4</sup> ..... of Britain, but it could be even older.

The green and white stripes of the flag <sup>5</sup> ..... by the House of Tudor, the Welsh dynasty that held the English throne from 1485 to 1603. Green and white are also the colours of the leek, another national emblem of Wales.

Of all the countries of the United Kingdom, the Welsh flag is the only flag <sup>6</sup> ..... on the Union Flag which is the national flag of the UK. There have been proposals to include the Dragon in the Union Flag but these have never been met <sup>7</sup> .....

Wales and Bhutan are presently the only countries to have a dragon on their flag.
