Allowance in the US

In the US, children get, on average, \$ 8.74 in allowance a week, not including gift cards on birthdays and holidays.

American experts believe giving an allowance creates a great opportunity for kids to learn about family values related to saving. But it is very important to define what to do with the money - what to buy and not to buy, define what they 'need' and what they 'want.' It is a great idea to teach them how to save, and piggy banks are a fun way to start doing it: kids can count the money and always check the total. This can give them a sense of familiarity with coins and notes, and also the importance of not spending all they have.

To receive an allowance, American kids do some household chores: they clean their room, do the dishes, empty the trash, among other things. They also do gardening, wash the car, or walk the dog.
