		<i>I love</i>	<i>I really like / I'm fond of / I'm keen on</i>
		<i>I prefer</i>	<i>I'm crazy about</i>
		<i>I hate / I can't stand / I can't bear</i>	

Neutral expression: *I don't mind ...*

**GRAMMAR :** like + verbe: aimer faire qqch

UK : verbe de goût + verbe-ing

US: verbe de goût + to + BV

**IMPORTANT :**

Enjoy et les expressions de goût avec le verbe être (to be fond of, to be keen on, to be crazy about) **sont toujours suivies de verbe-ing**, jamais de to + BV
