

What does each criterion refer to? – Match the criterion with the definition

Criterion 1: Content	• The text includes all the required content.
Criterion 2: Communicative achievement	• The communicative purpose (Ex. sharing information about a friend) is reasonably achieved. • The text is understood by the reader. Very few parts are difficult to follow.
Criterion 3: Organization 1	• The ideas mostly follow a logical sequence.
Criterion 3: Organization 2	• Includes the correct structure of the text almost fully. • Connectors and phrases are used effectively.
Criterion 4: Use of English 1	• The sentences use the required vocabulary from the unit.
Criterion 4: Use of English 2	• Most of the grammar structures in focus are used correctly.
Criterion 5: Mechanics	• There are few errors in punctuation, capitalization or spelling.
