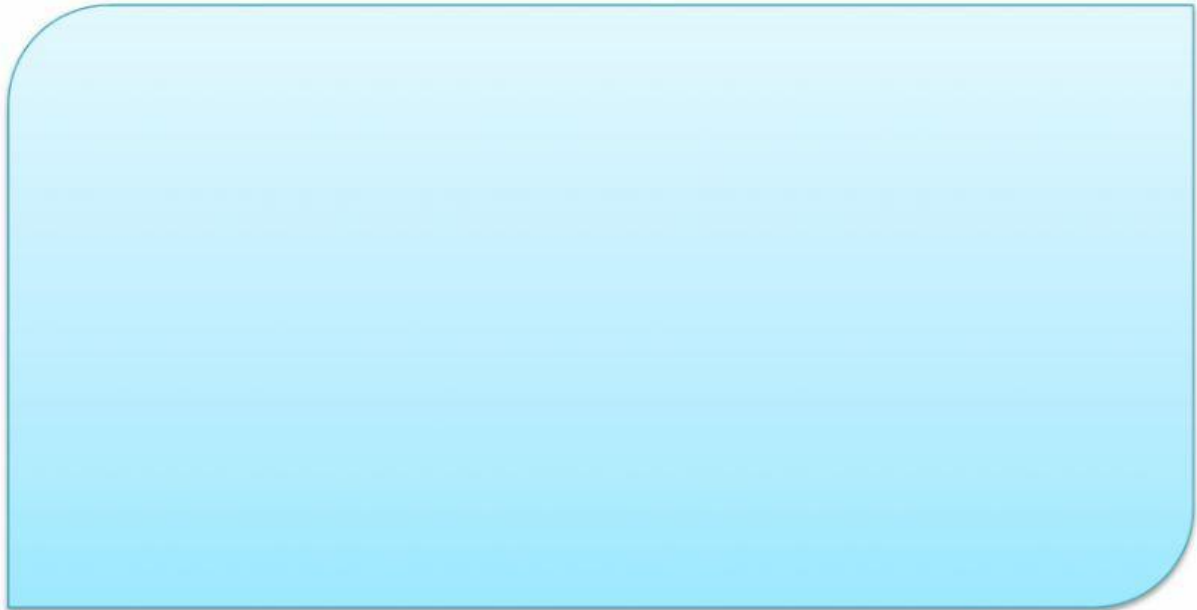


Noun Phrases

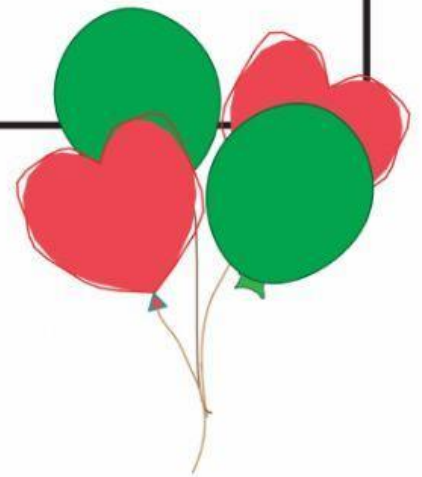


A noun phrase is a group of words that contains a noun and all its modifiers (including articles, adjectives, and possessive nouns) and functions as a noun.

Example: The old storekeeper is very generous.
