Advice from the Famous

Section 1

1 The word *advice* comes to English from the Old French word *avis* meaning opinion, view, judgement. *Avis* came to French from the Latin phrase *mi est visum*, meaning "in my view." In English, *advice* means an opinion or recommendation offered to someone about what they can or should or shouldn't do.

Section 2

2 Sometimes we can all use a little inspirational advice in our lives. There are many sources of advice available. We may seek advice from family, friends, or people we work with. Some people turn to newspapers for advice. There is a special section in many newspapers called the advice column. People write to the advice columnist, who responds in a way that all the readers can see.

These days, many people look for advice from the Internet. There are collections of advice available there from some of the world's most recognizable people.

Section 3

3 Many of these well-known people warn us not to be afraid of risk and not to give up when we encounter problems. For example, Mark Zuckerberg, one of the founders of Facebook, said "The biggest risk is not taking any risk. In a world that is changing quickly, the only strategy guaranteed to fail is not taking risks." Basketball superstar

Michael Jordan was quoted as saying, "If you're trying to achieve, there will be roadblocks. I've had them; everybody has had them. But obstacles don't have to stop you. If you run into a wall, don't turn around and give up. Figure out how to climb it, go through it, or work around it." Former U.S. President Clinton also advised people to continue despite difficulties. He said, "If you live long enough, you'll make mistakes. But if you learn from them, you'll be a better person. It's how you handle adversity, not how it affects you. The main thing is never quit, never quit, never quit."

Section 4

4 Another common theme was living in the here and now. Chinese philosopher Lao Tzu wrote, "If you are depressed, you are living in the past. If you are anxious, you are living in the future. If you are at peace, you are living in the present." Actor Liam Hemsworth remarked, "Tomorrow doesn't exist, yesterday is gone. The more I remind myself of that, the stronger I feel." Apple Computer pioneer Steve Jobs once said, "For the past 33 years, I have looked in the mirror every morning and asked myself: 'If today were the last day of my life, would I want to do what I am about to do today?' And whenever the answer has been 'No' for too many days, I know I need to change something."

Section 5

5 Naturally, many people want advice about their jobs or careers. In fact, one of the most commonly heard quotes deals with choosing a career: "Do what you love and you'll never work another day in your life." Oddly enough, it is not known for sure who first gave this advice. Some people think it was said quite recently, by performer Marc Anthony. Others attribute it to Mark Twain, the 19th-century American author. Still others believe it was first said some 2,500 years earlier by Chinese teacher and philosopher Confucius. Regarding his work, entertainer Jon Stewart said, "I want to look back on my career and be proud of the work, and be proud that I tried everything."

Greek philosopher Plato would probably have disapproved of Stewart's idea. Plato said, "All things will be produced in better quantity and quality, and with greater ease, when each man works at a single occupation making use of his natural gifts, without bothering with anything else."

Section 6

6 Another common theme to look for advice on is friendship. British author C. S. Lewis wrote, "Friendship is born at that moment when one person says to another: 'What! You too? I thought I was the only one.'" Jennifer Aniston, star of the US TV show *Friends*, appropriately has an upbeat view of friends. "Where would you be without friends? The people to pick you up when you need lifting? We come from homes far from perfect, so you end up almost parent and sibling to your friends—your own chosen family. There's nothing like a loyal, dependable, good friend. Nothing."

Section 7

7 Sometimes people misunderstand the advice that they have been given. The writer and comedian Paul Steinberg recalls the time when he was a young child and his grandmother said to him, "Don't get too close to people. You'll catch their dreams." He thought her advice meant, "Always stay somewhat separate from everyone around you as a kind of self-protection. Don't get so close to people that their dreams become your dreams." Her advice became a guiding principle in his life. Many years later, he went to visit his grandmother and told her how important her advice had been to him. She said, "I never said that."

"What? Of course you did! I remember it well."

"I didn't say anything about catching dreams. What I said was, 'Don't get too close to people. You'll catch their germs.' I didn't want you to get sick."
