Land snails range widely in size. While many of them are only a few inches long and often weigh only a few ounces, there are land snails that reach almost 12 inches, like the Giant African Land Snail, a species endemic of Africa.

Snails move at an incredibly slow speed. An average adult moves at a speed of 1 millimeter per second. While moving, snails leave behind a trail of slime, a lubricant they produce to allow them to easily move across any types of terrain without injuring their bodies. Land snails aren't able to hear at all, but they have eyes and olfactory organs. They use their sense of smell to find food.

A snail shell is made of calcium carbonate and keeps growing as long as the snail grows. It keeps adding more calcium carbonate to the edge of the shell until the snail reaches adult size.

You will find that snails are most active at night. They may come out during the early morning hours as well. Don't waste your time trying to figure out males and females, because snails are hermaphrodites, meaning that they have the reproductive organs of both sexes. They conceive and lay eggs.

The average life-span of a snail is approximately 10 to 15 years in captivity. However, it is believed that many species can live up to 25 years this way. In the wild, however, the life-span varies from species to species, but ranges from 2-3 years in a few cases and 5-7 for other kinds of land snails.

Which animal has the fastest snapping jaws? If your answer is a shark or perhaps an alligator, you will have to think of smaller animals. The answer is a trap-jaw ant, or *Odontomachus bauri*, which lives in Central and South America. Its mouth parts move at 35 to 63 meters per second. Another way to think about this is that the ant's jaws close at 125 to 233 kilometers per hour. That is 2,300 times faster than the blink of an eye! Scientists were able to measure the amazing jaws' speed using high-speed video techniques.

Even more amazing is the speed these ants grab food or prey, using the same energy to move. As the ant closes its jaws, it uses them to push off the ground—faster than the eye can see without slow motion video. A snap of its jaws can launch it up to 8.3 centimeters in the air.

Trap-jaw ants cover ground the same way. Not only can they quickly evade predators, animals that prey on other animals, but often a group of ants will start jumping simultaneously. Imagine a lot of popcorn popping. It would be hard to grab just one. Researchers think this "popcorn" effect may help the ants escape, by confusing their enemies.

Humans have suspected for over a century, that these ants used their jaws to jump, but have proof with today's modern video equipment.
