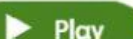

Interviewer:

Andrés Ruzo: Yes, traveling has always been a very big part of my life. When I was a child, my parents used to take my sisters and me on trips during the school holidays. We visited other family members living in different parts of Peru, Nicaragua, and the United States. I remember my parents used to say, "Travel is the best education." Now, I'm older, and I still think this is true. For the past few years, I have been traveling quite a bit—sometimes as many as three times per week!

Interviewer:

Andrés Ruzo: Wherever you travel on the planet, there is always something new to explore. Traveling is like stepping into the pages of a book, or walking onto the screen of a documentary—it gives you the ability to enter a new world. I also think it can change you and give you a whole new perspective because through travel, you can connect with people from across the globe. Think about it: right now, at this moment, almost 8 billion people across the planet are living and experiencing their loves, fears, hopes, and dreams—just like you are in your life. If you travel, you can connect with some of those 8 billion people, hear their stories, and experience different ways of life.

Interviewer:

Andrés Ruzo: Currently, I have about eight trips that I am planning. I'm going to visit Peru, Nicaragua, Mexico, Canada, and Chile as well as Texas, Florida, and Hawaii in the United States. Many of these trips are for work, others to visit family, and others are for my own personal interest.

Interviewer:

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Andrés Ruzo: I always have to do some research first. What will the weather be like? What have I got to pack? Is there anything particularly cool or special that I must see in this place? Or delicious food that I need to taste? My advice is to prepare for everything and then just go with the flow. For me, there will always be too much I want to see, do, try, and experience, and not enough time to do it all. As a result, planning ahead helps me focus on the things that I think I will enjoy most.

Andrés: Of course! In fact, I've never had a journey where everything went 100% perfectly to plan. Some of the worst situations included being on an airplane that had to make an emergency landing. Another time, I was on a boat that started sinking in Mexico. And while I was living in Miami, we often had hurricanes and bad weather, so my flights were regularly delayed, rerouted, or canceled. But these events don't often ruin trips for me. They are all a part of the adventure story that you can tell your family and friends when you come home.
