PUBLIC TRANSPORT IN LONDON

You are never far from public transport in London. The public transport network is large and busy. In fact, it's one of the largest and busiest public transport systems in the world.

THE LONDON UNDERGROUND

This is Londoners' favourite way to travel within London, because it's the fastest. They call it "the Tube". There are 12 London Underground lines, and each has its own colour. The Circle Line, for example, is yellow on the Tube map, and its trains have yellow hand rails. If you want to visit London lots of times, you should get an Oyster card. This card makes your journeys cheaper and you only have to buy it once because it never expires. You can decide how much money to put on your card, and when.



BLACK CABS

London's taxi drivers, or "cabbies", have amazing knowledge of the city. Black cab drivers must know thousands of streets. They have to take a very difficult test to show that they know the quickest routes between different areas of London. Some people spend years preparing for the test! Using a taxi is a good way to meet a Londoner... because the cabbies always want to chat to their passengers!



LONDON BUSES

London's red buses are not just a symbol of the city. They provide a very useful service. London buses are usually faster than cars. That's because London's roads have sections that are only for buses. Cars mustn't use them. Also, car drivers have to pay a charge to enter central London, so there aren't many traffic problems. The newest London buses use electricity. One of them appeared in the 2012 James Bond film Skyfall. In 2014, the payment system changed. You can't use cash to pay for your journey any more. You have to use an Oyster card, a travel card or a bank card.



CYCLE HIRE

There are bikes for everybody all over central London. People pay to access the bikes for 24 hours, seven days or a year. After that, they can take a bike from any "docking station" and return it to any docking station. You can use the bike for up to 30 mins without paying anything extra.
