Walter: I enjoy **looking / to look** at electronic equipment but I can't afford **buying / to buy** it. It's usually far too expensive.

Question 3: Are there any kinds of shops you hate **going / to go** into?

John: I hate supermarkets. I usually forget **buying / to buy** the things I went there for, so I avoid **going / to go** into them. Fortunately, I can do most of my food shopping online.

Walter: I refuse **going / to go** into shoe shops with my girlfriend. She tries on ten pairs and then decides **buying / to buy** the first pair.

Question 4: Do you enjoy **buying / to buy** clothes for yourself?

John: Not really. I only go into a clothes shop when I need **buying / to buy** a new shirt or something. For me, shopping is a necessity, not a pleasure.

Walter: I love **having / to have** new clothes, but I never manage **finding / to find** time to go shopping.
