More rain fell in Tutong yesterday. A lot of the road was flooded. Heavy rain in high areas flowed down to low areas. The flood became worse. The water level has risen from 30cm to 50cm overnight. It is not safe for smaller vehicles now.

The army sent two trucks to move people away from the flood. They started to help people to leave their homes yesterday afternoon.

One of the residents who went on the army truck was Abang Izzat. The 35-year-old farmer said that he owns a van, but he thought it was too risky for him to drive it through the flood. He said, "My van is too low for the water level, so I decided to take the truck." Izzat also said that his friend will be coming to take him back to his home. He said, "I have lived in this area all my life. I am used to the floods."

Later, Izzat's friend told him the water was so high that the wheels of his vehicle were underwater. Izzat said that he was not bothered by the flood.

The army trucks were still helping the residents of the area last night.
