SECTION I (5 points)

History of the Olympic Games

The first Olympics were in Ancient Greece, almost 3,000 years ago. There was only one event, a short race, and the games finished after one day! They were in a place called Olympia. That's why the games are called the Olympics.

The first modern Olympics were in Athens, Greece, in 1896. Fourteen countries competed and there were 43 events, including discus, wrestling, and weightlifting. The United States won the most gold medals.

The Olympic flag was first used in the Olympics in Antwerp, Belgium, in 1920. There are five rings to represent the five continents. Each ring is a different color: blue, yellow, black, green, and red. At least one of these colors is on every flag in the world.

More than 10,000 athletes competed in the Olympics in London 2012. There were 204 nations. The United States won the most gold medals again!
