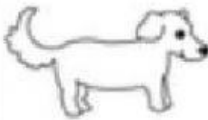
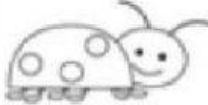

by Aesop

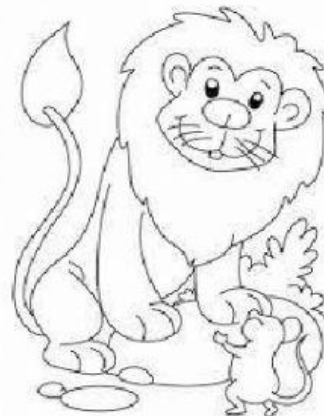
