We **didn't use to live** in a container house; we lived in an apartment.

Did you **use to visit** the city centre a lot? No, we **didn't**.

Aff: **subject + USED TO + verb (infinitive)**

Neg: **subject + DIDN'T USE TO + verb (infinitive)**

Int: **DID + subject + USE TO + verb (infinitive)**
