What is GPS?

Humans have looked to the skies to find their way (26) _____ ancient times. Today, all we need is a simple hand-held GPS (short for Global Positioning System) receiver to figure out exactly where we are anywhere in the world.

GPS is a system. It's (27) _____ of three parts: satellites, ground stations, and receivers. Satellites act like the stars in constellations—we know where they are supposed to be at any given time. The ground stations use radar to make sure they are actually where we think they are. A receiver, (28) _____ you might find in your phone or in your parents' car, is constantly listening for a signal from these satellites. The receiver figures out how far away it is from (29) _____ of them.

Once the receiver calculates its distance from four or more satellites, it knows exactly where you are. From miles up in space your location on the ground can be detected with incredible precision! They can usually (30) _____ where you are within a few yards of your actual location. More high-tech receivers, though, can figure out where you are to within a few inches!

Oprah Winfrey was born into poverty in rural Mississippi to a single teenage mother and later raised by different family members. Her childhood was **chaotic** because she moved around a lot. But while she was still in high school, she got a job reading the news for a local radio station. She went on to become one of the world's most famous talk show hosts.

Winfrey's story has been an inspiration for many people. And it's included in the latest season of *Good Night Stories for Rebel Girls: The Podcast*. In the podcast, notable women read from the popular book series of the same name. They read the stories of extraordinary women in a fairy tale format. This season includes episodes about entertainer Josephine Baker, gymnast Simone Biles, and others.

Winfrey's story is read by her best friend, Gayle King. King is a broadcast journalist who has known Winfrey for many years. "I was impressed by her accomplishments," she shared. "**She** doesn't have a family legacy to help her. She did this. She's been breaking barriers and ceilings since she was 19."

King hopes kids are inspired by the true stories on the podcast. She says Winfrey's story shows girls how much they can accomplish if they believe in themselves. "You have to be fearless," she says. "You have to know that you will make mistakes, and that's okay, and they do not define you."

People who live in New York are used to seeing and hearing airplanes flying overhead. But on the morning of September 11, people stopped on the streets and looked up. The sound of an approaching airplane was too loud, and the plane seemed to be flying too low. To the horror of people watching below, the airplane flew straight into one of the twin towers of the World Trade Center.

American Airlines Flight 11 hit the north tower at 8:46 a.m. The impact of the crash tore a hole that stretched from the 93rd to 99th floors of the building. Smoke and **flames** poured out of the tower. Many people thought they had just seen a terrible accident. But 17 minutes later, a second plane flew into another one of the World Trade Center buildings—this time into the south tower.

United Airlines Flight 175 crashed into the 77th through 85th floors of the south tower at 9:03 a.m. Some cell phone and TV station cameras caught the second attack on film. The footage was played over and over again on television. Soon people knew that hijackers—individuals who **capture** an aircraft, ship, or vehicle by force—had taken over the planes. A group of men had taken control of the cockpit of each airplane and flown them into the buildings on purpose.

First responders—including police officers, firefighters, and paramedics—arrived within minutes of the first attack on the World Trade Center. **They** rushed into both towers to help people trapped inside, even though it would be an extremely difficult rescue operation. Almost all the elevators in the twin towers had stopped working. So rescuers started climbing up the stairs, but many were blocked by rubble or fire. Still, firefighters forged ahead, ignoring the danger.

The attacks on September 11, 2001, shook the world and made people realize that even a powerful country like the United States could be a victim of terrorism. But the horrific event also brought Americans closer together. As U.S. senator John Kerry said at the time, "It was the worst day we have ever seen, but it brought out the best in all of us."
