Steve Jobs

Steven Paul "Steve" Jobs (Steve Jobs) was born on February 24, 1955, and died on October 5, 2011. He was an American entrepreneur, businessman, inventor, and industrial designer. He was the co-founder, chairman, and chief executive officer (CEO) of Apple Inc. He joined with Steve Wozniak to co-found the Apple. They are widely recognized as pioneers of the microcomputer revolution of the 1970s and 1980s.

Jobs and Wozniak co-founded Apple in 1976 to sell Wozniak's Apple I personal computer. They gained fame and wealth a year later for the Apple I. In 1983 he produced Apple Lisa but it was unsuccessful, followed by the breakthrough Macintosh in 1984. In 1985, Macintosh with Apple LaserWriter, the first laser printer to feature vector graphics.

After leaving Apple, Jobs took a few of its members with him to found NeXT. It is a computer platform development company specializing in state-of-the-art computers for higher-education and business markets. The new company, Pixar, would eventually produce the first fully computer-animated film, Toy Story—an event made possible in part because of Jobs's financial support.

In 1997, Apple merged with NeXT. Within a few months of the merger, Jobs became CEO of his former company, reviving Apple on the verge of bankruptcy. Beginning in 1997 with the "Think different" advertising campaign, Jobs worked closely with designer Jonathan Ive to develop a line of products: the iMac, iTunes and iTunes Store, Apple Store, iPod, iPhone, App Store, and the iPad. Mac OS was also revamped into OS X (renamed "macOS" in 2016), based on NeXT's NeXTSTEP platform.

Lemongrass is a tropical island plant in the grass family. Some species (particularly *Cymbopogon citratus*) are commonly cultivated as culinary and medicinal herbs because of their scent. It resembles that of lemons (*Citrus limon*).

Lemongrass grows to about 2 m and has magenta-colored base stems. It can grow in many tropical climates, most notably in Southeast Asia.

Lemongrass can be used for the production of citronella oil, which is used in soaps. It can also be used as an insect repellent (especially mosquitoes) in insect sprays and candles, and in aromatherapy. The principal chemical constituents of citronella, geraniol, and citronellol, are antiseptics, so they are used in household disinfectants and soaps.

Besides oil production, lemongrass is also used for culinary purposes, as a flavoring. It is a common ingredient in Thai cooking and can also be found in dishes from Indonesia, Sri Lanka, and India.

Banana Muffins

Ingredients

- 1 ½ cups all-purpose flour
- 1 cup sugar
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- ½ teaspoon salt
- 3 medium ripe bananas
- 1 large egg
- 1/3 cup vegetable oil
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract



Directions

1. In a large bowl, combine dry ingredients.
2. In another bowl, mash the bananas. Add egg, oil and vanilla; mix well.
3. Stir into the dry ingredients until moistened.
4. Fill greased or paper-lined muffin cups half full.
5. Bake at 375° for 18-22 minutes or until a toothpick inserted in the center comes out clean.
6. Cool for 10 minutes; remove from pan to a wire rack to cool completely.

Hail is precipitation (rain) of balls or pieces of ice with a diameter of 5 mm to more than 15 cm. In contrast, ice pellets (small hail) have a diameter less than 5 mm.

The formation of hail usually requires cumulonimbus or other convective clouds with strong updrafts. So, it often accompanies thunderstorms.

Large hailstones are often characterized by alternating layers of clear and opaque (not transparent) ice. It is caused by irregular rates of freezing. In areas where the temperature is not far below 0 °C (32 °F), freezing occurs slowly,

allowing trapped air to escape and producing clear ice. When the hailstone then moves into a much colder area, freezing occurs quickly, trapping air and producing a layer of white ice.

Hail is extremely destructive to buildings and crops. If large enough, it may be dangerous to animals exposed to it. Hailstorms are most common in the midlatitudes and usually last around 15 minutes. They ordinarily occur in mid-to-late afternoon.
