## Future tense - Will

This week, we are going to focus on what will happen in the future. When talking about the future, use the future with **will** to talk about an event in the future that you have just decided to do, for predictions and for promises.

This is an example of the description of a job in the future. Read the following:

Now, teachers are humans who are in the classroom, but **in the future** teachers **will** be replaced by robots.

Being a teacher **will** be **better in the future** because human teachers **will** have time to prepare lessons while the robots teach children.

Many people think that robots will be better because they **will** not get tired like human teachers. Robots **will** work all day and will not need to sleep. Robots **will** not need holidays, so schools **will** be open for longer.

Now, study the information below. Compare how a firefighter in the present will be different in the future.

|              | Now (present)           | Future (after)                              |
|--------------|-------------------------|---------------------------------------------|
| Equipment    | ladder, axe             | drones, jetpacks for fire fighting on water |
| Helmet       | helmet protecting heads | full-face helmet, breatheable through smoke |
| Technologies | -                       | full-body suit, robots                      |
