Rule 1 – conditional 'if' - type 'zero'

FORM

In zero conditional sentences, the tense in both parts of the sentence is the simple present.

If clause (condition)	Main clause (result)
If + simple present	simple present
If this thing happens	that thing happens.

Examples:

- If you **heat** ice, it **melts**.
- Ice **melts** if you **heat** it.
- If it **rains**, the grass **gets** wet.
- The grass **gets** wet if it **rains**.
