As well as the national press, there are many regional and local newspapers. These range from dailies to Sunday papers and others that are published once a week. Regional and local papers contain features on the community as well as details of local theatre and cinema performances. Local papers are not divided into “popular” and “serious” papers. They are usually written in a simple style. Many local newspapers, which usually contain nothing but advertisements, are delivered free and are called “free sheets”.

Match the descriptions with the names of newspapers:

«South Wales Evening Post»

A daily newspaper, covering the towns of Bolton and Bury in north-western England. It is published each morning from Monday to Saturday.

«Edinburgh Evening News»

A daily tabloid newspaper published in Cardiff. It focuses on latest news, breaking stories, sport and business.

«The Bolton News»

A regional daily newspaper distributed in north-west England. It is published from Monday to Saturday. It is famous for its breaking news, sport and celebrity gossip.

«South Wales Echo»

An evening tabloid newspaper published from Monday to Saturday in Scotland. It contains breaking news. The newspaper is delivered to doors by paper boys.

«Glasgow Evening Times»

A newspaper that is printed daily except Sundays. It is published in the capital city of Scotland. The content is mainly local news, crime, transport, health, sport.

«Manchester Evening News»

An evening daily tabloid newspaper published in Wales. It produces a range of special features and supplements on entertainment, TV, motoring, property, employment and sport.
