African-American Explorer

Shortly after the slaves had been set free in our country, an African-American boy, Matthew Henson, was born. When he was nine years old, he became an orphan. He worked hard at different jobs to take care of himself. His favorite job was traveling to other parts of the world as a cabin boy on a ship.

Later when Lieutenant Peary needed another member for his team of explorers, someone suggested Matthew Henson. Lieutenant Peary's choice soon proved to be a good one. Henson quickly learned how to build the large sleds they needed to carry food supplies. He also learned to make the igloos of ice blocks they used as they traveled north trying to reach the North Pole. And he became an expert at handling the sled dogs.

Henson did not give up even when their team faced one problem after another. They ran into severe storms and suffered from frostbite and other injuries. Some members of the team became sick and died. The explorers often ran out of food. They killed walruses whenever possible.

Time after time the team tried to reach the North Pole. Once they came within 500 miles and had to turn back. The most dangerous part of the expedition was crossing the frozen Arctic Sea. They had to cross swift water filled with huge chunks of ice. They decided a ship would be necessary, one that was tough enough to break ice into pieces. After getting such a ship, they started out again. Finally, there was too much ice for the ship to continue. They went on by foot. At last they reached their goal—the North Pole! It was a great moment for Lieutenant Peary and Matthew Henson. They were the first people to accomplish this amazing task!
