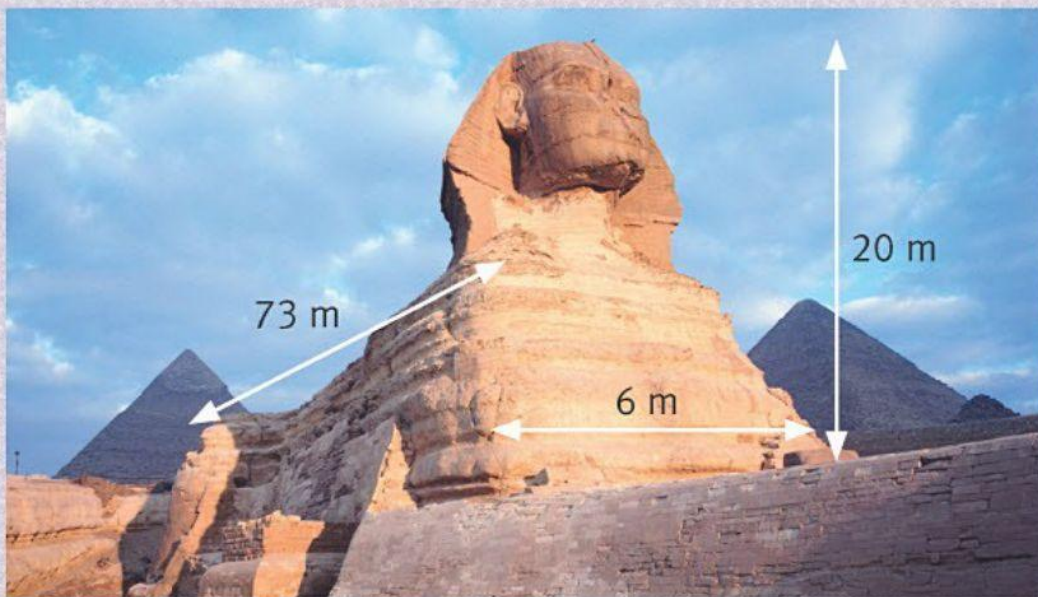


Measurements

How old is your sister? How long is the film?
How big / expensive / nice / far is the hotel?
- 2 We use *deep, high, long, old, tall* and *wide* to talk about size and age. We put the adjective after the measurement. (Note: We don't use *big* or *heavy* in this way.)
She's 17 years old. He's 175 centimetres tall.
NOT ~~*This table is two metres big.*~~
- 3 We use *away* for distance.
The sea is 100 kilometres away.
