Possessive 's

- Add 's to a singular noun: *My sister's husband.*
- Add ' to a plural noun: *My sisters' husbands.*

Possessive pronouns

A possessive pronoun has got one form for singular and plural.

It's my book. It's mine.

They're my books. They're mine.

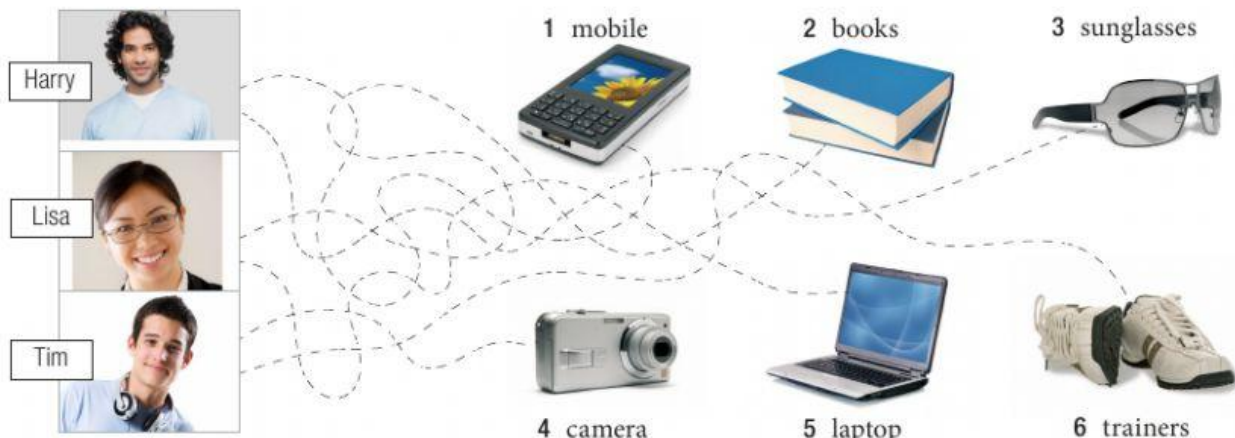
You can use a noun + possessive 's in the same way: *Whose mobile is this? It's David's. / It's my brother's.*

Whose laptop is this? It's mine.

Whose sunglasses are these? They're mine.
