"Be going to" is used for a present situation which points to the future (evidence in the present):

**I'm going to marry  
her in three  
months.**

"Be going to" is used when giving some commands:

**They're going to  
have the baby in  
a month.**

"Be going to" is used when someone has decided or intends to do something in the future (prior plan):

**You're going to  
finish playing soon  
because it's late.**

"Will" is used when we think or believe something about the future (prediction without evidence):

**I'll close the door,  
don't worry!**

"Will" is used in formal orders. It expresses the order as a definite future action:

**You'll stop with  
this now!**

"Will" is used when we decide to do something now (instant decision):

**They are married!  
They will be  
parents soon.**
