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## Reading

### Rat (Feb 7<sup>th</sup>, 2008–Jan 25<sup>th</sup>, 2009)

Rats are great thinkers and they love to solve problems. They're creative and they like hard work. A lot of Rats own their own businesses. Other good Rat jobs: lawyer, manager.



### Ox (Jan 26<sup>th</sup>, 2009–Feb 13<sup>th</sup>, 2010)



Oxen work to get what they want. They work well on their own, and want a job that is well paid. Oxen are kind, so they are great teachers. Other jobs: doctor, builder.

### Tiger (Feb 14<sup>th</sup>, 2010–Feb 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2011)

Tigers, you're going to have an exciting future! You like to be busy, and you love new situations, so there might be a few jobs in your future. Lots of Tigers are police officers. Other jobs: firefighter, pilot.



### Dragon (Feb 5<sup>th</sup>, 2000–Jan 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2001)



Dragons, you like being the one telling people what to do. You are never tired. You hate things that are repetitive, so being an office worker isn't a good idea. Lots of Dragons are coffee shop owners. Other jobs: engineer, writer.

### Snake (Jan 24<sup>th</sup>, 2001–Feb 11<sup>th</sup>, 2002)

Snakes, you never say "no"! You work for what you want, and you work hard. You're creative, and you're good at remembering things. Scientist, farmer ... both good jobs for you. Other jobs: journalist, painter.



### Horse (Feb 12<sup>th</sup>, 2002–Jan 31<sup>st</sup>, 2003)



Born between Feb 12<sup>th</sup>, 2002 and Jan 31<sup>st</sup>, 2003? You're a Horse. You love talking and being with people. Boring jobs aren't for you! Horses are often language teachers. Other jobs: mechanic, sports person.
