India's Deadly Train Derailment

On 19th October 2018, an Indian Railways passenger train crashed into a crowd of people near Amritsar in Punjab. 59 people were killed and around 100 more were injured when the train that was travelling from Jalandhar to Amritsar hit them at high speed.

This tragic event occurred during Dussehra, a popular Hindu festival that takes place every year. The celebrations involved the burning of huge puppets and a fireworks display. Some of the crowd were sitting or standing on the railway tracks watching the festivities when the accident happened. It is believed that they did not hear or see the approaching train because of the fireworks. Many people were also filming the celebrations on their phones.

After the incident, a state of mourning was declared in Punjab and offices and schools were closed. It remained unclear who was to blame for the disaster and the families of the victims held angry protests demanding justice.

The district's deputy commissioner, Kamaldeep Singh Sangha, stated that the festival's organisers had written to local police to inform them in advance about the festival. He said that the police had given permission for the event to take place, but had advised them to follow the guidelines for public gatherings as outlined by the Supreme Court. These guidelines say that permission for such an event should also be attained from the health and safety department, the fire department and the railways. Spokespersons from all of these departments said that the festival organisers did not ask for their permission before holding the event.

According to the chairman of the Railway Board, Ashwani Lohani, the railway was not to blame because they had not been told about the event in advance and the driver was therefore not expecting people to be on the tracks. It was also reported that the smoke from the burning puppets and the darkness made it impossible for the train's driver to see the people in time to stop. The driver claimed that he applied the emergency breaks and sounded the train's horn as soon as he saw the people, however many witnesses have argued that the horn was not sounded.

While those involved in the incident argued over who was to blame, the families of the victims mourned their dead relatives and friends. Amarinder Singh, Punjab's chief minister, ordered a full investigation into the incident and stated that the families of the people who lost their lives would receive financial compensation.
