Affirmative

I / You / We / They **like** snakes.
He / She / It **likes** snakes.

Negative

I / You / We / They **don't like** snakes.
He / She / It **doesn't like** snakes.

don't = do not **doesn't = does not**

Questions and short answers

Do I like snakes? Yes, I **do.** / No, I **don't.**
Does she like snakes? Yes, she **does.**
No, she **doesn't.**

Present continuous

Affirmative

I'm studying.
He / She / It **'s studying.**
You / We / They **'re studying.**

Negative

I'm not studying.
He / She / It **isn't reading.**
You / We / They **aren't reading.**

He **isn't** reading. = He **'s not** reading.
We **aren't** reading. = We **'re not** reading.
